1. Significant Accounting policies:

1.1 Accounting Concept :

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India to comply with the Accounting Standards specified u/s. 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Act. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. 1.2 Revenue Recognition:

1.3 Fixed Assets

1.4 Depreciation:

1.8 Earnings per Share:

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the number of equity share outstanding during the year.
